



Class Descriptions

All Classes are \$125 for 1 hour a week for 5 weeks (unless otherwise stated)

Puppy Play and Learn (Only \$10)

For puppies 8 – 16 weeks; early social skills and life experiences will prepare your puppy for real life! Drop in without registration, to our puppy club play and learn group! Get valuable information on raising your puppy for real life, build the foundation for the best future behavior and ask questions about anything and everything. 1 hour, \$10 for puppies 8-16 weeks. An additional group is offered at 10 am for pups - 5 to 8 months.

Every Saturday 9:00 a.m. for puppies 8-16 weeks. If your puppy is just a bit older than 16 weeks *give us a call*.

Real Life Puppy

For puppies 16 weeks to 8 months; This class combines play, social skills and basic obedience to start your puppy of on the right path to understanding real life with people, other dogs and every day challenges.

Critical fear periods (where dogs decide for life what they are afraid of or can handle) start and end very quickly (Between 12 – 16 weeks) in this time your dog should get out there, see people, dogs and real life situation.

Studies prove that puppies that go to early training are less likely to be given up, less likely to bite are better with kids and strangers as well as live longer, healthier lives!

Real Life 1

For adolescent dogs 8 months to 1 ½ years; this beginner class is great for newly adopted dogs, and young dogs that missed out on early training. Maybe you were too busy, or you just adopted, or maybe your dog was great when you first got it, but now you've got a few behavior problems and overall disobedience that you want to tackle now before your dog gets any older.

This class teaches the basics, as well as helping your dog make better decisions when faced with dogs, joggers, people coming into your home, and every day real life!

Commands taught: SIT, DOWN, STAY, WAIT, LEAVE- IT, OFF, No Pulling, HEEL, COME, GO SAY HI, and a release word.

Real Life 2

Are you and your dog NOT a beginner but also, really not great at some of those commands like COME, STAY and pulling (heel). Take this class with your 1 ½ to any age adult dog to polish up what you think they should know! Liberate yourself from doing all the work, and build a better bond with your dog and regaining control of your dog when he is distracted, and off leash. This class polishes up: SIT, DOWN, STAY, OFF, WAIT, a release word, Go Say HI! And teaches: LEAVE IT, HEEL and COME

Advanced Life!

You don't have to be advanced to take this class. The idea is to give you the tools so you and your dog understand each other, get the responses you want, understand why sometimes commands don't work and even be able to pass the CGC test or move on to Pet Therapy. This class teaches off leash Heel and Come as well as proofs behaviors when away from the home and within the home. Dog should already know sit, down, stay, wait, off, leave it and be well on its way to a good HEEL.

This class is \$145 and offers the CGC test at the end of 5 weeks.
